County.

RESOLUTION/UNDERTAKING FOR HIGHWAY PERMITS BETWEEN TOWN OF POTSDAM & ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Town of Potsdam is desirous of St. Lawrence County Department of Highways providing shared services such as paving, signage, road stripping, blasting and other routine maintenance activities to the Town, and

WHEREAS, both the Town of Potsdam and the County f St. Lawrence are desirous of promoting partnering efforts for the safety of the traveling public in St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, the joint cooperative endeavor, the Town of Potsdam and the County of St. Lawrence desires to be reimbursed for their expenditures, and

WHEREAS, the Town is aware that the County may incur liability in the providing of the services and wishes to indemnify the County in this regard,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the Town of Potsdam will indemnify and hold harmless the County, their officers, directors, partners, representatives, agents and employees from and against any and all claims, suits, liens, judgments, damages, losses and expenses, including legal fees and all court costs and liability (including statutory liability) arising in whole or in part and in any manner from injury and/or death of person or damage to or loss of any property relating to or arising out of any negligent or intentional acts and/or omissions of the Town of Potsdam or any of its directors, officers, employees, contractors, representatives, or agents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following request for General Liability (GL) coverage is as follows:

General Liability Insurance

On an "Occurrence" basis with the following limits:

\$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

\$3,000,000 General Aggregate

\$1,000,000 Products Aggregate

- \$ 50,000 Fire damage Legal Liability
- \$ 5,000 Medical Payment Expense

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that St. Lawrence County shall be an additional insured on the GL Policy, via ISO endorsement CG 2026.

HIGHWAY AUTHORIZATION TO SPEND MONEY - CHIPS

MOTION made by Councilperson Carvill and second by Councilperson Grant BE IT RESOLVED pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, the Town of Potsdam agrees that moneys levied and collected for the repair and improvements of highways, and received from the State of New York for repair and improvement of 124.00 miles of highways in the amount of \$290,524.49 shall be expended as follows:

- On the road commencing at Bagdad Road starting Miller Road and leading West toward County Route 35 a distance of 1.01 miles there shall be expended not over the sum of \$87,560.00
- On the road commencing at South Canton Road starting at County Route 59 and leading West toward County Route 35 a distance of 1.01 miles there shall be expended not over the sum of \$101,664.49.
- On the road commencing at Old Potsdam-Parishville Road starting at Perrin Road and leading East toward Parishville a distance of 1.00 miles there shall be expended not over the sum of \$101,300.00.
