HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

John Keleher reported the following:

- Spring work and clean-up is nearing completion.
- We received word from PAVE NY that the town should receive approximately \$115,000 extra for paving.

CEO REPORT

- 5 Permits were issued in March for a total of \$155.00.
- Code official attended NYS training in Lake Placid and the Tug Hill Conference.

COURT REPORT

- \$15,321.74 in fines was collected by Justice Mason
- \$17,770.00 in fines was collected by Justice Charleson
- 386 cases were closed.
- 203 new cases were opened.
- Ms. Guyette's restitution check (#24779) for \$1,930.50 was applied to Judge mason's cases 14-VTL cases which paid them in full and 1 VTL case as a partial payment in the amount of \$47.00. Receipts for these transactions are M560-M9570 and M9572-M9575.
- Village parking ticket money in the amount of \$2,388 was submitted on Judge Charleson's report.

ASSESSOR'S REPORT

Mr. Snyder reported:

- Data collection is being conducted on new construction in preparation of the tentative assessment roll.
- That he has been elected to the NYSAA executive board or a two year position.
- That he will be attending several training classes over the next few months.

RECREATION REPORT

Rose Rivezzi reported:

• The recreation committee will be meeting later this month and they will review the proposed kiosk letter and report back to the board.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Village Trustees Eleanor Hopke and Nick Sheehan asked the Town Board members to consider funding a paid fire driver position. The village currently funds 4 paid fire drivers and is considering not replacing the fire driver who is going to retire. With family health costs and overtime pay it costs the village approximately \$99,500 to fund this position. (Base pay is \$43,851.20 + \$15,000 or more in overtime costs + health insurance.) Currently the paid drivers only drive village trucks within the village limits, unless they have permission due to a mutual aid call. Mr. Sheehan said that volunteers would become responsible for driving the village trucks during the unmanned shift.

Former Chief John Keleher said that they responded to 562 calls last year, with over 50% being at the universities. 96 calls were in the town, outside the village and 466 calls were within the village. He said that the drivers take care of the equipment and trucks and said that in the past the Town of Potsdam had given \$600,000 to purchase a truck.

The Town of Potsdam contracts with the Potsdam volunteers in the amount of \$108,000, as well as West Potsdam Fire, Hannawa Falls Fire, and Norwood Fire. The total fire protection budget is \$234,221.50.

Town board members agreed that there are no funds in the 2016 budget to fund a paid driver and would have to have more information before making any considerations.

OLD BUSINESS

SH 56N WATER/SEWER RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING

- Two separate funding applications will be submitted to USDA.
- Each \$20,000 application is reimbursable at 75% for a total of \$10,000 (\$5,000/each study)

Kevin Fueka told the board about the grant application. He said that two separate applications would be submitted to USDA to in the amount of \$20,000, of which 75% is reimbursable. If approved the town's portion would be a total of \$10,000 (\$5,000/application.).

Board members confirmed that the funds could be taken from the BDZ since it was a capital improvement. There was a great deal of discussion regarding the project and Mr. Fueka said that this application would allow an engineering study to evaluate our current facilities to see if they can handle an expansion and help to determine a cost of expanding the water and sewer district. He said that there would be a preliminary engineering report and they would also conduct an environmental review (SEQR).

BOARD DISCUSSION

- Board members were assured that the firm C2AE (previously Burley Guminiak) had been vetted and they are working on the Louisville water expansion.
- Councilperson Rich is concerned that this expansion will be forced on property owners that don't want or can't
 afford municipal water.
- Councilperson Carvill shared her concerns about the burden of cost, but was interested in finding the benefits.
- Councilperson Rivezzi said that she is interested in finding out the cost per parcel and how the district would benefit owners. She expressed concerns about water contamination and septic failures.
- It was pointed out that by doing this study our facilities would be evaluated and costs would be determined.

TISDEL STUDY OF UNIONVILLE SEWER PLANT

Supervisor Beattie told the board that he would like to solicit a bid for engineering services from Tisdel Associates to see if the Unionville sewer plant could accept additional sewage. Beattie will speak to Tisdel and report back to the board.

UNIONVILLE WATER TANK REPLACEMENT

Steve Siddon, Valley Water Solutions has reported that there are leaks in the water holding tanks causing the pumps to run excessively. This could create problems with the pumps, which would prohibit residents from getting water. He recommended replacing the 16 year old holding tank, because replacing the bladder in the old tank has a high failure rate.

Bids follow:

\$6,000 to replace the rubber bladder with a high failure rate.

\$14,325 to purchase stainless steel with rubber bladder (same as current tank.)

\$6,500 to purchase a fiberglass tank with different bladder (recommended.)
